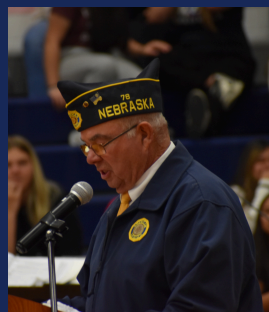




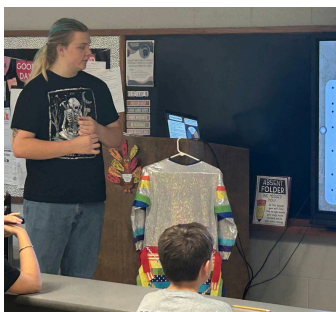
## VETERANS DAY
